# MAY IS POPPY MONTH! Honor the dead—aid the living. Wear a paper poppy this Memorial Day—

### Monday, May 29<sup>th</sup>



The red crepe paper poppy, replica of the Flanders Poppy was officially adopted in 1921 as the Memorial Flower of the American Legion and the American Legion Auxiliary. Through the years it has become the symbol of the dead-their memorial flower. The red crepe paper poppy is hand-made exclusively by hospitalized veterans of the World Wars, Korean War, Vietnam War, Grenada/Lebanon and Panama conflicts and the Persian Gulf War. It is made of paper to give the veteran a maximum amount of work and income. In many cases the income derived from this source constitutes the only income of that hospitalized veteran. Each year volunteer workers, members of the American Legion Auxiliary, offer these poppies to the public, to be worn by them on Memorial Day, so they may pay tribute to the Nation's honored war dead. All contributions made by the public are used by the American Legion Auxiliary exclusively for the welfare of the needy veterans and their families throughout the state of California. Auxiliary members will be offering poppies to the general public at the Marina Walmart Tuesday, May 23 through Friday, May 26, from 10 AM-2 PM. Your donations will be greatly appreciated.

From the Podium... As our fiscal year comes to an end on June 30th, I would like to recap what the Unit has accomplished in support of American Legion Auxiliary programs on the Central Coast this year. We have given over \$10,000 in donations, distributed in various ways thru each program we promote locally.

Some of our contributions include volunteer time and in-kind/or cash donations to the District 28 Stand Down for Homeless Veterans, Ride 2 Recovery, veterans at the VA Palo Alto Hospital Spinal Cord Ward for Thanksgiving and Christmas, veterans at the Menlo Park VA, and the DAV Fall and Spring Fishing Derby event, and we served breakfasts to veterans at the Monterey County Fair. We members also funded, through Wreaths Across America, wreaths for placement on the gravesites of five deceased veterans at Arlington National Cemetery, who are directly related to members of The American Legion Family at Post 694. We will be offering Poppies to the citizens of Marina during May.

For our Americanism, Children and Youth, Education, and Girls State programs, we donated \$1,000 to the Children's Miracle Network; we awarded \$2,300 in scholarships and educational stipends to deserving local students; and we again sponsored the Americanism Essay Contest for students in grades 4 through 12 in Marina public schools; we supported our local high school sports programs and sponsored a PONY Baseball/Softball team; we provided holiday gifts to a military family, our children and grandchildren; and we are sending three Delegates to California Girls State this year. In the community we volunteer at our local food pantry and serve daily breakfasts at the Teen Center.

Many thanks to our members who continually support and volunteer at our fundraisers and help to keep our Unit strong.
