### MAY IS POPPY MONTH! Wear a paper poppy this Memorial Day—Monday, May 28<sup>th</sup>

The red crepe paper poppy, replica of the Flanders Poppy was officially adopted in 1921 as the Memorial Flower of the American Legion and the American Legion Auxiliary. Through the years it has become the symbol of the dead—their memorial flower. The red crepe paper poppy is hand-made exclusively by hospitalized veterans of the World Wars, Korean War, Vietnam War, Grenada/Lebanon and Panama conflicts and the Persian Gulf War. It is made of paper to give the veteran a maximum amount of work and income. In many cases the income derived from this source constitutes the only income of that hospitalized veteran. Each year volunteer workers, members of the American Legion Auxiliary, offer these poppies to the public, to be worn by them on Memorial Day, so they may pay tribute to the Nation's honored war dead. All contributions made by the public are used by the American Legion Auxiliary exclusively for the welfare of the needy veterans and their families throughout the state of California.

Each part of the poppy has special meaning. The red petals stand for the vast outpouring of blood; the yellow and black center, the mud and desolation of all battlefields. The green of the stem is symbolic of the forests, meadows and fields where generations of Americans have perished to make this land free. The stem represents the courage and determination of our fallen warriors. The assembled product, a flower, is a symbol of resurrection, which is sure to follow. You are urged to take a Poppy when offered one, and make a donation to help support our hospitalized veterans.

The Auxiliary mission statement reads "In the spirit of service, not self, the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary is to support The American Legion and to honor the sacrifice of those who serve by enhancing the lives of our veterans, military, and their families, both at home and abroad. For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens, mentor youth, and promote patriotism, good citizenship, peace and security." I am extremely proud of our accomplishments this year, as we have worked to satisfy Unit goals in the six major programs and Membership. Our Membership Chair, Carol Yates, did a fantastic job with the program, and it is, in large part due to her efforts that we made goal this year. Our Americanism and Education Chair, Lis Billingsley, was again most successful in her oversight of the Americanism Essay Contest, and quest for deserving students to receive Auxiliary scholarships at local, District, and Department levels. Our Children & Youth Chair, Sherryl Panek, through various events, raised nearly \$9,000 for the Marina High Softball Program, Marina PONY Softball, and the Children's Miracle Network. Legislative Chair, Barbara Ferguson, urged members to write their elected officials at all levels in support of the many and varied bills pertaining to veterans and veteran rights. Our **Poppy Chair**, **Roberta Brown**, was responsible for the distribution of some 4,000 poppies in our community, and for the placement of 88 handmade poppy wreaths at the California Central Coast Veterans Cemetery. Our Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation (VA&R) Chair, Michelle Soares, and Hospital Representative Connie Raya worked tirelessly in support of <u>all</u> veterans. As a result, Unit in-kind donations to the Palo Alto and Menlo Park VA facilities, including knitted/crocheted afghans, lap robes, caps and mittens, scarves, toiletries, magazines and puzzle books, amounted to nearly \$8,000. Cash donations in the amount of \$700 were given to the California Central Coast Veterans Cemetery, Wreaths Across America, and Post 31 Hero Bears Project. It has been my pleasure to work with these dedicated women and serve as Unit President this year.

My special thanks to <u>all</u> Unit members who support the mission and are always willing to lend a helping hand. With your support and encouragement we are able to remain a viable, productive Unit. And, many thanks, also, to the Post 694 Legion Family members who continually support and volunteer at our fundraisers. Together, we are Legion Family strong!

### AUXILIARY DUES INCREASE NOTICE

After several lengthy discussions this year Unit members approved an annual dues increase, raising membership fees to \$30 for Seniors and \$5 for Juniors, effective July 1, 2018. The rate hike is necessary because National approved a \$3 per capita increase for 2018-19, and it is anticipated that Department will also approve a \$3 per capita increase at their convention in June. In order for the Unit to remain solvent and continue to support and serve our community and our veterans, there was little choice but to follow suit. We are fully aware that the increase may well affect Auxiliary members who live on fixed incomes, but hope everyone understands that the annual economic impact on the Unit would be significant without this increase.
